Personal Statement

Lee has a diverse range of experience within the specialisation of landscape design. His portfolio includes a multitude of urban revitalization projects, large scale planning projects and iconic community development schemes.

This project range has enabled Lee to work on a variety of scales and at every stage of the works, from outline planning through concept design, design development, construction documentation and contract administration. This has provided Lee with the ability to design freely and creatively whilst still maintaining a strong sense of the build ability of the end product. This also extends to the use of soft landscape materials; Lee has an extensive knowledge of planting and utilises this to enhance and support his designs.
